Stabi-Craft Marine's Victorian dealership has been chosen to launch the Kiwi company's new 829 Super Cab Weekender GIII at the Melbourne Boat Show.

Recently named Stabi-Craft's Australian Dealer of the Year, MY Marine will showcase the new vessel at the July 3-7 event.

With over 600 boats on display at the 30,000sqm Melbourne Exhibition Centre, Stabi-Craft's Australian sales manager Leon Johnston has no doubts the 829SC will stand out from the crowd.

"Ultimately it's designed with the Australian market in mind – particularly Victoria and the Northern Territory where they travel such large distances," Leon said.

"This is the perfect weekender – a boat that can go the distance, handle any conditions and still dish up all the creature comforts."

As one of Stabi-Craft's first Australian dealers, Michael Rozakis, of MY Marine, is an authority on the positive buoyancy boats.

"You would be hard pressed to find a guy that knows more about Stabi-Craft in Australia," Leon said.

Michael was excited about unveiling the new model.

"The boat show really demonstrates both our commitment to Stabi-Craft and our growth as a company to be able to demonstrate the pride of the fleet vessels and new release models that will get a lot of attention at and after the show," Michael said.

With the Melbourne fixture hailed as one of Australia's largest boating extravaganzas, MY Marine will be joined on site by representatives from Tasmania's Deegan Marine and Adelaide Shores Marine, ensuring a wealth of Stabi-Craft expertise.

Featuring the innovative GIII pontoon design, the 829 is guaranteed to be a talking point among the thousands who flock to the show.

Hull technology cemented Stabi-Craft's place in boat manufacturing history over 21 years ago – the GIII advances it even further, softening the profile once more for an exponential increase in handling.

Capable of carrying 760 litres of fuel and 100 litres of water, there are no limits with the road legal 829 SC – so anyone can Adventure with Confidence™.

There's an eight-rod rocket launcher as standard and a choice of transom boxes – the Super Game has live bait tank with tuna tubes for the serious fisher, and the Super Fish has a large live bait tank, underfloor fish bin and bait board with additional rod holders.

For the family, Stabi-Craft have installed a 45 litre Engel fridge, a 2 burner Origo cooker and electric toilet among the range of features – a hot shower is also an option.

The 829 SC Weekender GIII will be joined in Melbourne by its little brother the 759 SC Sport GIII – a stunning revamp of an already popular model which now has a greater internal beam and is stacked with options.
